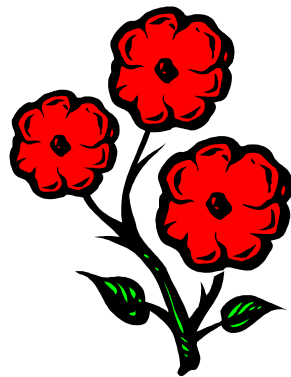
Evangel Hall
